

Independent Student Verification Worksheet 2021-2022

Your 2021-2022 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. Important Note: The instructions below apply to you and your spouse, if you are married. Notify the financial aid office if you or your spouse filed separate IRS income tax returns for 2019 or had a change in marital status after December 31, 2019.

Instructions: Complete this section if you and your spouse filed or will file a 2019 IRS income tax return (s). *The best way to verify income is by using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (IRS DRT) that is part of FAFSA.* In most cases, no further documentation is needed to verify 2019 IRS income information that was transferred into your FAFSA using the IRS DRT if that information was not changed by the FAFSA filer.
