- 1 Harwood Gate is the visitors entrance and parking lot for the undergraduate admissions office.
- 2 Center for Communications and Engineering houses the School of Communications, the School of Engineering and the Mount Carmel Auditorium. The main floor includes a multimedia computer classroom, open media lab and an audio/video equipment loan facility. The lower level includes engineering workshops and a machine shop. The building also houses the Office of Multicultural and Global Engagement, the Center for Psychological Science, Academic Affairs, and faculty and administrative offices.
- 3 Echlin Center houses the offices of Undergraduate Admissions and Financial Aid, faculty offices and classrooms. The Kresge Foundation Lecture Hall and Perlroth Boardroom are located here.
- 4 Clarice L. Buckman Center contains classrooms and faculty offices. The center's Clarice L. Buckman Theater is used for guest lectures.
- 5 Tator Hall houses the Game Design & Development Lab and other classrooms, science laboratories and faculty offices.
- 6 Carl Hansen Student Center contains a bookstore, post office, student lounge areas and the People's United Bank ATM. Student media and government, other campus organizations and Starbucks are on the second floor.
- 7 Mount Carmel Dining Hall Here, students can choose from a dozen dining stations including Pollo, which offers chicken wraps; Breakfast All Day; Rosso Verde with a range of Italian pasta dishes, subs and gourmet pizzas; Revolution Noodle and Sushi; stations for grilled snacks and sides, fresh salads, muffins, deli options, smoothies and burgers; and gluten-free, vegan and vegetarian items and more.

- 8 Arnold Bernhard Library, marked by the clock tower with the Nils Sahlin Carillon, forms part of the University Quadrangle. The library also houses the Lender Family Special Collection Room with artwork from the Great Hunger plus the Learning Commons, Bursar, Registrar, Student Administrative Services, Information Services, Technology Center and the Executive Office Suite.
- 9 In addition to the School of Business, the Lender School of Business Center contains classrooms and team study rooms, faculty and administrative offices, the Center for Innovation & Entrepreneurship, the Terry W. Goodwin '67 Financial Technology Center, and the School of Business Career Development Center.
- 10 Ed McMahon Communications Center features a spacious, professional, all-digital, high-definition television studio; a media innovation classroom; 4K collaborative editing suites and a 7.1 surround sound screening theater.
- 11 Quinnipiac's Main Entrance serves the Arnold Bernhard Library, Faculty Office Building, Athletic and Recreation Center, Lender School of Business Center, Ed McMahon Communications Center, Center for Communications & Engineering, the North Parking Lot and athletic fields.
- 12 Additional faculty offices are housed in the Faculty Office Building.
- 13 Athletic and Recreation Center houses Burt Kahn Court, locker rooms, training rooms and staff offices. It also includes a multipurpose surface used for volleyball, tennis and basketball; suspended walking track; combination large weight room and exercise center; and two multipurpose dance/aerobics studios. Six lighted tennis courts and a range of outdoor courts and fields are nearby.
- 14 Health and Wellness Center, home to Student Health

Services, is open weekdays, 8 a.m.–8 p.m. and weekends, 10 a.m.–4 p.m. Counseling Services are available weekdays, by appointment, from 9 a.m.–5 p.m.

- 15 The Commons buildings are traditional-style residence halls.
- 16 The Hill buildings offer apartment-style housing, including kitchens.
- 17 Irmagarde Tator Residence Hall, a traditional-style residence hall, also houses Public Safety.
- 18 Dana English Residence Hall is a traditional-style residence hall.
- 19 Student Affairs Center contains the offices of the vice president of student affairs and Residential Life. Students gather to eat and socialize in the Bobcat Den on the lower level.
- 20 The Village residence halls have split-level apartments, each with three bedrooms, a living room and bathroom.
- 21, 22, 23 Perlroth, Larson and Troup feature four-bedroom suites.
- 24 The Complex buildings offer apartments, including kitchens.
- 25 The Ledges is a traditional-style residence hall.
- 26 Mountainview Residence Hall consists of four-bedroom suites.
- 27 Pat Abbate '58 Alumni House and Gardens, on Hogan Road, houses Development and Alumni Affairs.
- 28 Development Building, on Hogan Road, houses Development and Alumni Affairs and the Alumni Board of Governors Room.

- 29 Service Entrance.
- 30 Mail Services Center and Facilities.
- 31 Dean Robert W. Evans College of Arts and Sciences Center buildings 1 and 3 house classrooms and faculty offices.
- 32 Catholic Chapel and Center for Religion.
- 33 New Road Entrance.
- 34 Peter C. Hereld House for Jewish Life, 560 New Road, features a kosher kitchen, a lounge, a study space and a large social room for Jewish services and traditional meals. The office of the university rabbi also is here.
- 35 Albert Schweitzer Institute at Quinnipiac University, 660 New Road, enhances the student experience through alternative spring break service trips, hosting world leaders on campus and exploring issues related to the Schweitzer philosophy.
- 36 Office of Human Resources is located at 554 Mount Carmel Ave.

Other Locations

Division of Public Affairs, 3071 Whitney Ave., is responsible for overseeing public relations, media relations, integrated marketing communications and the Quinnipiac Poll. The University Events and Community Partnership staff also are housed in this building.

Office of Integrated Marketing Communications, 3093 Whitney Ave., is responsible for Quinnipiac University's brand strategy, identity and university marketing communications across channels and audiences.

Quinnipiac University Poll, 20–60 West Woods Road, regularly surveys residents in Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Iowa, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Virginia and across the nation about political races and issues of local, regional and national concern. A satellite office is located at 3099 Whitney Ave.

Ireland's Great Hunger Museum, 3011 Whitney Ave., is home to the world's largest collection of art relating to the famine that occurred throughout Ireland from 1845–52.

Quinnipiac University Online, 3035 Whitney Ave., expands Quinnipiac's educational offerings for adult learners with online undergraduate, graduate, doctoral and certificate programs as well as online summer classes.

Quinnipiac Theatre Arts Center, 515 Sherman Ave., serves as Quinnipiac's main stage for its student-run theater productions. It also includes a black box theater.

The music building is located next to the Theatre Arts Center at 485 Sherman Ave.

Whitney Village, 3075 Whitney Ave., is an apartment-style residence hall with fully equipped kitchens.

Directions to the Mount Carmel Campus

From Providence and east, or New York City and west, via I-95 (Connecticut Turnpike): Take I-95 to New Haven. Then take I-91 north to Exit 10 (Route 40). Follow Route 40 approximately three miles to its end (at Whitney Avenue). Turn right onto Whitney Avenue (Route 10) and proceed north for 1.4 miles. Turn right onto Mount Carmel Avenue, and go 0.3 miles to campus.

From New York City and west, or Hartford and east, via the Wilbur Cross (Merritt) Parkway: Take the Parkway (Route 15) to Exit 61 (from the west) or Exit 62 (from the east). Turn right onto Whitney Avenue (Route 10) and proceed north three miles to Mount Carmel Avenue. Turn right onto Mount Carmel Avenue and go 0.3 miles to campus.

From northern New Jersey: Follow Route 287 over the Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge (Tappan Zee Bridge) and continue east on Route 287 to the Merritt (Hutchinson River) Parkway, Exit 9N. Follow above directions from the Parkway (Route 15).

From Hartford, Boston and northern New England via I-91: Take I-91 south to Exit 10 (Route 40). Follow Route 40 approximately three miles to its end (at Whitney Avenue). Turn right onto Whitney Avenue (Route 10) and proceed north for 1.4 miles. Turn right onto Mount Carmel Avenue and go 0.3 miles to campus.

From Waterbury and New York state via I-84: Take I-84 to Exit 26. At the end of the exit, bear right on Route 70 toward Cheshire. Continue on Route 70 to Route 10. Turn right on Route 10 and go about seven miles to Mount Carmel Avenue. Turn left onto Mount Carmel Avenue and go 0.3 miles to campus.

From the North Haven Campus: Exit the parking lot and go straight to the first traffic light. Turn left onto Route 5/ Washington Avenue and follow one mile to I-91 south. Follow above directions from I-91.

From the York Hill Campus: At the bottom of the drive, turn left onto Sherman Avenue. At the next light, turn left onto Whitney Avenue. At the next light, turn right onto Mount Carmel Avenue.
