

4.2 Indicators of Teaching Effectiveness

There are several ways that we will be measuring our graduates' teaching efficacy. They are as follows:

- 1) **edTPA:** edTPA serves as our first indicator of a graduate's teaching effectiveness. It is completed at the end of the candidates' graduate year during student teaching and involves the pre-service teacher planning, teaching and assessment. It is the first indicator that will assure us that our candidates are truly prepared to teach:

“edTPA is a performance-based, subject-specific assessment and support system used by teacher preparation programs throughout the United States to emphasize, measure and support the skills and knowledge that all teachers need from Day 1 in the classroom. Aspiring teachers must prepare a portfolio of materials during their student teaching clinical experience. edTPA requires aspiring teachers to demonstrate readiness to teach through lesson plans designed to support their students' strengths and needs; engage real students in ambitious learning; analyze whether their students are learning, and adjust their instruction to become more effective. Teacher candidates submit unedited video recordings of themselves at work in a real classroom as part of a portfolio that is scored by highly trained educators. edTPA builds on decades of teacher performance assessment development and research regarding teaching skills and practices that improve student learning” (retrieved from







- 2) Teacher Practice Ratings:** We asked a sample of 20 recent graduates teaching in four states (Connecticut (CT), Massachusetts (MA), New Jersey (NJ), and New York (NY)) to self-report the rating they earned on their district teacher practice evaluation.

It should be noted that each state has different focal criteria that they use to evaluate teacher practice (e.g., “Planning and Preparation”, “Assessment for Learning”, etc.). In addition, states use different performance levels by which they evaluate teachers’ performance on those criteria and/or progress toward proficiency. For example, though most use a four-point scale, MA uses a five-point scale on their formative assessment. For these reasons, it is difficult to compare teacher practice ratings from different states. However, there are still some summary statements we can make about this sample.

First, 95% of our completers were rated in the top half of their state’s teacher evaluation summative scoring rubric. For completers who were scored using a four-point scale (those teaching in CT, NY, and NJ), 88% scored a three (either “Proficient” or “Effective”) and 12% scored a four (“Exemplary”) (see Figure 1)

Figure 1. Teacher Practice Ratings for QU Completers (n=17)



Students teaching in MA reported formative ratings on their progress toward stated goals, which was assessed on a five-point scale (1 (no progress), 2 (some progress), 3 (significant progress), 4 (met goal), and 5 (exceed goal)). One of our completers earned a score of 3 (significant progress) and two earned a score of 4 (met goal). These completers are not included in Figure 3 because of the differences in scales.

- 3) Focus Groups:** In the summer of 2018, a sample of 2017 candidates (N = 7) volunteered to participate in a focus group with the goal of understanding graduates’ perceptions of their impact on student learning during their first year teaching.

Focus groups were video-recorded and transcribed. The Associate Dean facilitated the focus group, asking the questions and guiding the discussion. Below are the questions asked during the focus groups. The responses were transcribed and coded using the InTASC Standards. Analysis will take place in the summer of 2019, and results will be presented to faculty and the Advisory Board the following fall.

Focus Group Questions:

Learner & Learning

- 1) Can you give me an example of a lesson you designed and implemented that was both a developmentally appropriate and challenging learning experience for your learners?
- 2) Tell me how you ensure inclusive learning environments that enable each learner to meet high standards.
- 3) Tell me about how you integrate individual and collaborative learning into your classroom.

Content Knowledge

- 4) Explain how you make content meaningful for your students.
- 5) How do you know that your students have mastered the content?
- 6) How do you encourage critical thinking in any of the content areas you teach?

Instructional Practice

- 7) Give me an example of how you use assessment to guide your decision-making.
- 8) Tell me about one of your best instructional strategies that you use to improve student learning.
- 9) How do you use technology to improve student engagement and learning?

Professional Responsibility

- 10) Can you share any opportunities you have taken to engage in professional growth to improve teaching and learning?
- 11) Tell me about a time you collaborated with colleagues, or other school professionals to improve instructional practice.
- 12) Tell me about one time you modeled ethical behavior for your students or colleagues.

In general:

- 13) Of the topics we covered, which is the most important to you and why?
- 14) Is there anything else you would like to share that will help us ascertain your impact on student learning and growth?

- 4) **Public School Student Surveys:** In the summer of 2018, several MAT faculty and graduate students met to discuss the possibility of distributing surveys to the students of our graduates to assess their perceptions of their teachers' teaching effectiveness. Based on the InTASC standards, we developed two 10-item surveys, one for elementary students and one for

secondary students, using developmentally appropriate language for each level. Students were asked to rate their teacher on each statement, ranging from 1 (disagree) to 5 (agree). In addition, students were asked if they had any additional comments about their teacher. Once the surveys were developed, faculty and administrators on the Advisory Board vetted them. Three of those administrators agreed to distribute the surveys to our graduates' pupils.

The first surveys were distributed to students of one of our graduates (Graduate 1), who teaches four Spanish classes in an upper middleclass high school. Individual items can be seen in the first column of Table 1. As can be seen from Table 1, Graduate 1 is rated highly by her students on all items—an indication that she is engaging in effective practices with her students.

ELEMENTARY SURVEYS

The third set of surveys were distributed to elementary students of seven of our graduates (named Graduates 1-8) in an urban K-8 school. Three are kindergarten teachers (Graduates 2, 7, 8) one (Graduate 3) is a second grade teacher, two (Graduates 5, 6) are fourth grade teachers and one (Graduate 4) is a fifth grade teacher. As can be seen from Tables 1 and 2, our graduates use effective practices with their students.

- Student ratings on Item 2 were significantly lower for Completer 7 than all other completers ($p \leq .001$ between Completer 7 and Completers 2, 3, 5, and 8; $p \leq .05$ between Completer 7 and Completer 6; $p \leq .10$ between Completers 7 and 4).
- Student ratings on Item 3 were significantly lower for Completer 7 than Completers 2, 3, and 8 ($p \leq .01$).
- Student ratings on Item 4 were significantly lower for Completer 7 than Completer 2 ($p \leq .05$), Completers 3 and 4 ($p \leq .001$), and Completer 5 and 8 ($p \leq .01$).
- Student ratings on Item 5 were significantly lower for Completer 7 than for Completer 2 ($p \leq .05$).
- Student ratings on Item 6 were significantly lower for Completer 7 than for Completer 8 ($p \leq .05$).
- Student ratings on Item 7 were marginally significantly lower for Completer 7 than for Completer 2 ($p \leq .10$).
- Student ratings on Item 8 were marginally significantly lower for Completer 4 than for Completer 2 ($p \leq .10$).
- Student ratings on Item 8 were significantly lower for Completer 6 than for Completer 2 ($p \leq .001$), Completer 3 ($p \leq .01$), and Completers 5 and 8 ($p \leq .05$).
- Student ratings on Item 9 were significantly lower for Completer 6 than for Completers 2, 3, 5, 7, & 8 ($p \leq .001$) and for Completer 4 ($p \leq .01$).
- Student ratings on Item 10 were significantly lower for Completer 4 than for Completers 2, 3, 5, 7, & 8 ($p \leq .001$) and for Completer 6 ($p \leq .05$).
